13TH ANNUAL ADVISORY FORUM ON CULTURAL ROUTES OF THE COUNCIL OF EUROPE

25-27 September 2024, Visegrád, Hungary

The Enlarged Partial Agreement on Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe (EPA), the European Institute of Cultural Routes, the Ministry of Culture and Innovation of Hungary, and the Hungarian Open Air Museum will organise the 13th Annual Advisory Forum on Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe in Visegrád, Hungary.



This year's Forum focuses on "Transmission and Innovation: Fostering Youth Participation along the Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe". The Forum aims to enhance youth participation in cultural heritage and its involvement in safeguarding and transmitting European values by providing a platform for dialogue and exchange of concrete practices and methodologies. The Forum will gather participants from the EPA member States, "Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe" certified and candidate networks, academic institutions, universities, and European and national stakeholders from the cultural heritage, youth, tourism, and civil society sectors.

The 2024 Visegrád Forum will provide an opportunity for dialogue and exchange of good practices and effective methods, drawing on good practices from the Council of Europe's Cultural Routes and methodologies from other cultural fields, such as museology. The Forum's objective is to strengthen the participation of young people in the field of cultural heritage and to initiate a dialogue on the involvement of young people in the process of preserving and transmitting European values.

The Forum's programme will include general discussion sessions, thematic sessions and workshops, as well as a ceremony for the inauguration of the routes/networks certified in 2024, also giving participants an opportunity to learn about the historical heritage of Visegrád and the cultural routes crossing Hungary, including the Iron Age Danube Route.
